

## **PHIL 311A 001: The Philosophy of Aristotle**

This course follows on from Philosophy 310, which is a prerequisite: it offers serious students of philosophy an introduction to the thought of Plato's most illustrious student, Aristotle. Aristotle's texts have come down to us in a less well-structured form than those of Plato, and we will adapt our reading style to suit the demands of the text, reading individual books and chapters in a thematic order designed to present Aristotle's thought as a coherent system. An intensive reading of difficult material, this course is not suitable for students without previous background in philosophy.
